OPPORTUNITY TO MEET NEEDS IN HAITI!

For the past few years around this time of the year, we have collected various items to help the people of Haiti. These items consist of dry goods (rice and beans); sheets, pillowcases, and towels; and shoes (we have an available supply of shoes to donate). We work with Arnold Garcon, a native Haitian preacher with the North Haiti Church of Christ (CAP HAITIEN) who graduated from Lipscomb University and has been self-supporting for the last 24 years. In a recent newsletter, Arnold reported that the damage caused by Hurricanes Isaac and Sandy left over 500 dead, 3500 homes destroyed, 4000 homes damaged, 200,000 homeless, and \$3 billion in damages. Arnold will be in Florida in early March to pick up donations. We will be collecting donations of the above items until the end of February. Boxes are provided in the back of the Fellowship Hall.
