Dear Church of Christ Oceanside Members,

It is that time of year when we reflect on the year past and are thankful for people like yourselves who make it possible to give humanitarian aid to some of the poorest people on the planet in 2010. Your selfless donation of time, finances, and the hearts of your members helped in many good works in the post-earthquake nightmare of Haiti in January and in Honduras all year. These are the two poorest countries in the Western Hemisphere. Homes were built for the poor and food distributed for the hungry. Medical and dental needs were met in the villages. Many badly needed medical supplies were sent to the state hospitals and clinics in the Tegucigalpa, Honduras and Port Au Prince, Haiti area. The medical clinic in Santa Ana, Honduras and pharmacy have been running full-time since August 15, 2007, with over 15,000 thousand patients given care and pharmaceuticals. What a privilege to be a part of this work. Casa de Esperanza is now a home to 15 children in Santa Ana, Honduras. The Mi Esperanza program continues to train women in trades so they can care for their families. The training center for women in Santa Ana is continuing to progress. Many of you directed funds to enable teens and adults to participate in the Torch trip this summer; 12 homes were built in June on the Hines/Davidson trip and 104 homes were built altogether this summer with all the Torch groups. We have sent 15 containers full of humanitarian aid and medical supplies from Louisiana and Florida. Some of the funds are used specifically to keep the church in Santa Ana, Honduras functioning as a body, as well as for the purchase of Bibles and medications. Tim Hines visited the congregation last week, and they continue to grow as a body. Soon we will have to raise money for a church addition. Praise God! Tim and I look forward to seeing your group each year as we know what a fine group of people you are, and you bring so much to the table for the poor. Without the Miller Building to store these supplies, we would not be able to afford to do as much as God allows. Your part in this is huge. Tim and I appreciate your hearts for mission work.

Thank you for your vision and sacrifice. We ask that you continue to pray for the work and keep up with the news on our websites ([www.torchmissions.org](http://www.torchmissions.org), [www.irccorp.org](http://www.irccorp.org), [www.torchmissionshonduras.blogspot.org](http://www.torchmissionshonduras.blogspot.org), [www.clinicadeesperanze.org](http://www.clinicadeesperanze.org)). Our trip this year will be June 13-26, 2011; we would love to have you be a part of the work personally, spiritually, or financially.
