Family Meeting Details (April 17, 2016)

We as Church of Christ Oceanside are incorporated by the state of Florida. As such we are required to have a congregational meeting each year. For this to be an official meeting we need to have a majority of the congregation present – so please plan on attending if at all possible. The meeting will be held directly after our Sunday morning worship service, on April 17, and will be held to about 30 minutes.

Agenda:

- Acceptance of revisions to the By-Laws – these are posted on the bulletin board and are available in digital format – if you would like a copy please email Jim Conn at jkjconn@gmail.com
- Election of Officers – President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and Secretary – these duties are outlined in the By-Laws.
- Election of an additional Trustee – we are required to have 3 trustees, currently the Elders are trustees but since we have only 2 Elders we need to add an additional trustee.
- Congregational approval for an family/associate minister – if we are to hire a family/associate minister we need to support this as a congregation – both in our time and in our money – increasing our contribution by a combination of budget line item reductions and increased giving.

Selection of Additional Elders

Recently it was announced that we are beginning the process of selecting additional Elders. The Elders would like the congregation to prayerfully consider the qualifications for an Elder in the church based on the following Scriptures: 1 Timothy 3:1-13; Titus 1:5-9; and 1 Peter 5:1-4. Members of the congregation should propose candidate(s) to John Branard and Bill Werner by Sunday, April 17, 2016. The Elders will consider those names submitted, including talking with those folks whose names have been submitted to determine their suitability for further consideration (e.g., desire to serve, qualifications). The Elders will put forward a final list of Elder candidates to the congregation on Sunday, May 1, 2016, and ask for the congregation to review, pray about, and provide any comments or feedback to the Elders over the following two weeks (ending Sunday, May 15, 2016). After this process is completed, we will need (based on our revised By Laws) a formal congregational meeting (with a quorum established) to approve/install the Elders. Two-thirds of the members present at the congregational meeting must approve each final Elder candidate submitted to the congregation for consideration.
