In the Mail

We recently received the following letter from Churches of Christ Disaster Relief Effort, Inc.:

Dear Brethren,
Your check in the amount of \$1250 was received by Churches of Christ Disaster Relief, Inc., and was greatly appreciated. We could not continue the Lord's work without the financial support from you and others.

We are currently helping Arizona and Colorado, due to the wild fires. We have helped Oklahoma and Texas, due to tornadoes and flooding. Recently, we have helped areas in Texas, due to the explosion of the fertilizer plant; Illinois and Tennessee, due to flooding. We have been helping Georgia and Mississippi, due to tornadoes; New Jersey and New York, due to Hurricane Sandy. We are prepared to send more shipments of food, baby supplies, cleaning products, personal care items, water, appliances, bedding and much other needed supplies to other disaster victims as needed.

During the first six months of 2013, a total of \$3.97M of assistance was provided in 12 states (62 shipments). Over \$757,000 was distributed to tornado victims in Oklahoma.

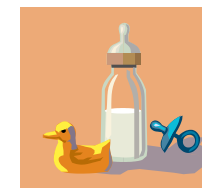

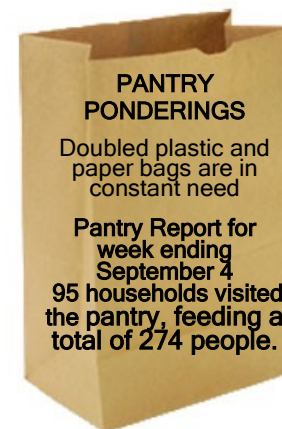
