It's time to bring in your plastic grocery bags! The pantry is in need of donations of plastic shopping bags again. Please leave them on the kitchen counter. Thank you so much.

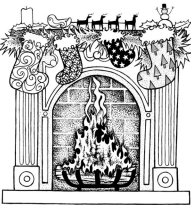
